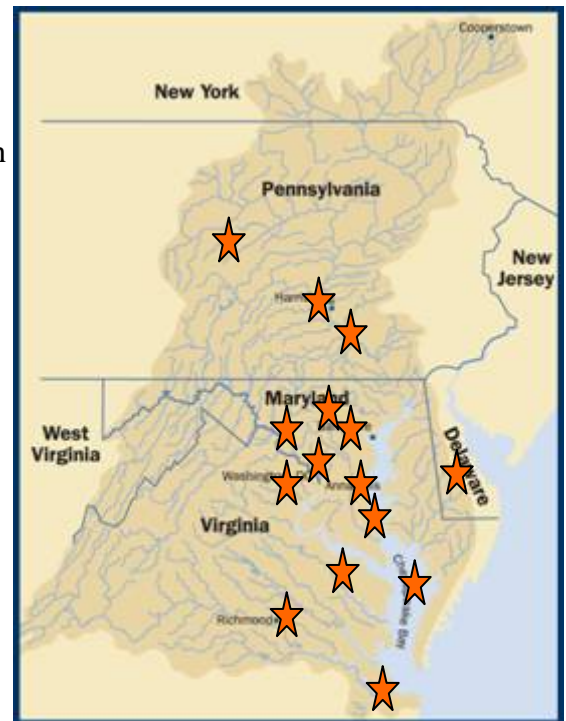
Cost: \$150.00 per 5-day Summer Course (activities, food, lodging, and education materials included)
